Since graduating from UTAS with a BPA (Theatre), Carrie has spent her artistic career collaborating on new works, either in the role of writer, performer, director, producer, cheerleader or coffee-getter. She is a founding member of Mudlark Theatre and the Radio Gothic collective, and is currently based in nipaluna, Hobart. Carrie's had numerous performing roles onstage and onscreen, with her debut

in a feature role as Ann Solomon in The First Fagin (2012), directed by Helen Gaynor. Most recently, she performed in The Box, by Nathan Maynard and Rob Braslin, for Mudlark Theatre (Best Performance, Tasmanian Theatre Awards 2024). For Mudlark, Carrie directed Cross by Stephanie Briarwood, and has written several plays including Beautiful: A Ghost Story, Strange Fruit, and Cafe. With SSYT, she wrote Chasing a Sound Like Rain, a youth theatre project for Ten Days, and Gros Morne Theatre Festival. For Radio Gothic, Carrie wrote and performed in The Hanniford Tapes for Dark MOFO (2018), and performed in Briony Kidd's The Pit and Alison Mann's The Illustrated Girl. She co-created The Motherload with never.the.less productions (2021-2023) and A Mouthful of C Words for Salamanca Arts Centre, led by Chris Mead (Best New Writing, TAS Theatre Awards 2023).
